1 In-conjunction Competitions

This is where you create up to 5 competitions at once. The main purpose of this screen is to collect details of the (up to 5) competitions that are being run on a given day, and to ask PowerGolf to then build all those competitions for you in the main Competitions file.

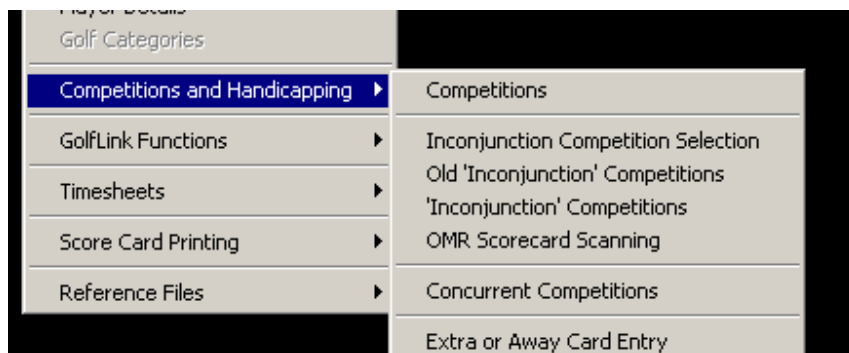
Another purpose of Inconjunction competitions is to provide a link between one or more competition(s) and a single Timesheet. With the Timesheet module installed you will be able to link a competition directly to a Timesheet from the Inconjunction competition details screen.

1.1 The New Inconjunction Competition system

The Inconjunction Competition system has been a feature of the Micropower Golf module for many years. A new version of the Inconjunction competitions has been released (October 2008). The changes and advantages of the new system are described in Sections 3, below.

Once the new system is activated,

- a new Inconjunction Competition setup screen will become accessible
- both the new and the old set up screens will be available from the menus
- The original setup screen will be relabeled in the menus as “Old ‘Inconjunction’ Competitions”. All competitions created in the past using the earlier version will still be visible in the original setup screen, but no new competitions can be created using this old screen. This old window is retained so you can view the details of previous competitions.
- all new competitions will be created using this new version, and competitions made using this new version will only be visible in this new window,



It is necessary that, at the time of activation of the new Version, all existing future Inconjunction competitions are recreated in the new version. If any of the competitions are linked to timesheets, the linking will have to be updated.

2 The earlier version of the Inconjunction Competition

Before the new version is activated:

Golf > Competitions and Handicapping > 'In Conjunction' Competitions

After the new version is activated:

Golf > Competitions and Handicapping > Old 'In Conjunction' Competitions

The details of the competitions are filled out just as normally done when creating competitions, except that because many of the details are common to all the (up to 5) competitions on the day, you only need to enter them once. The fields common to all competition are in the Blue Box labeled 1.

The fields that need to be filled in for each competition are in the Red box labeled 2. Their significance is the same as that of the equivalent fields in the Normal Competition screen:

3 The NEW Inconjunction Competition Screen

Golf > Competitions and Handicapping > 'In Conjunction' Competitions

The new Inconjunction competition screen has been designed to allow users to still create up to up to 5 competitions on one day which all can be linked through to a single timesheet, only with even more competition selections.

Using the new Inconjunction competition screen the competition details can now be customized for each competition. Under the new screen only those details in the Blue boxes labeled 1 are common to all competitions. Everything else will be determined by the specific competition.

The main purpose of the new Inconjunction competitions screen is to allow greater flexibility when creating competitions for a day, and to provide a link between team events, such as Ambrose and Best of and Timesheets.

One significant difference is that you can now declare a different course for each competition.

Another significant change, made possible by the change just mentioned, is that the second competition for a given gender can now be a singles competition. This allows you to create, for example, a singles Competition for your A grade off the black markers, and a separate singles competition for your B and C Grade players off the Blue markers. When there are two singles competitions defined, you will have to nominate which competition each player is entering as they are registered. A player cannot play in both singles competitions.

3.1 Creating a Comp using the New Inconjunction Competition Screen

To create a new Inconjunction competition, Click on the 'New' button

1. Enter the Date the event will be played
Enter the Time the event will be played. The Time field will default to 6.00am
Enter the Name of the Competition
Enter the Countback holes, if required
2. Select the rights to enter to the competition
Select whether you will allow Kiosk score entry
3. This will list any competition created under this Inconjunction competition
4. Each competition created under the new Inconjunction competition screen can now be created separately, with different score and competition type, by gender. Simply select the gender of the competition you wish to create, to fill in the details for that specific competition.

Click on the Save button to build the Competition and if applicable link to a suitable timesheet

3.2 How to Create a Custom Competition

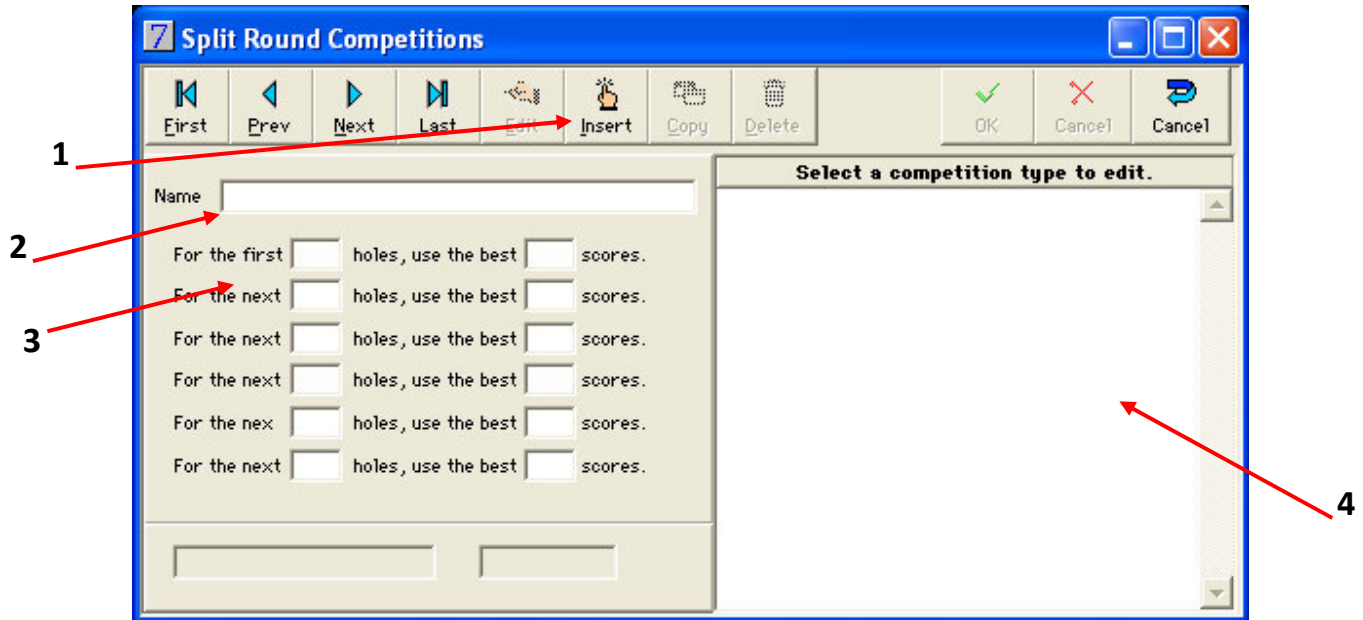

1. To create a new competition type, click the Insert button
2. Give the competition a name
3. Fill in the rules for the competition. Each competition can have up to 6 rules for the 18 holes
4. Once the competition type has been saved, it will be added to the list, which allows you to go back and edit the competition type at any time

3.3 Registering Players

The Registering Players screen (Figure 6) for an Inconjunction competition is designed to appear like a timesheet, with the player names appearing in groups across the screen.

However, when the Timesheets module is active, this screen is often not used, because players are registered via the timesheet. The names of players registered through the timesheet will appear in this window as if they had been registered using this window*.

If the player was registered correctly through the timesheet, the tee number and tee time will show next to the row.

1. The main change to the Registering Players window is the ability to choose the singles comp for a player when there are 2 singles comps.

Note also that the screen also allows you to set the scorecard auto-print properties for each of the six competitions.

*It is advised that, if you attach a competition to a timesheet, all players are registered for the competition through the timesheet. This will avoid players being registered twice and errors occurring

3.4 Entering Scores

The Inconjunction Score Entry Screen (Figure 7) is designed to make it very easy to process cards in group number order

1. Like the Player Registration Screen, the Inconjunction Score Entry screen deals with groups of players. When you first enter the screen, the group with the lowest number will be displayed, and as you finish entering scores for a group, the next group in number order will be displayed.
2. The screen presents a variable number of score entry boxes, depending on the settings for the competition. The necessary Score Entry Boxes will appear according to the team combinations being used in the event by the group. The maximum number of boxes possible is 10. The Score Entry boxes adjacent to each name are for the Singles Score for each player. The Score Entry Boxes on the black lines joining the players are for the Team Scores, where a team consists of the two players at either end of the line concerned.
3. The Score Status will change while the cursor is in the Score Entry Box. The Radio Buttons and Colour Coded text will indicate the Score's Status
